- **Basic Farm Tour** - \$2.00/person This price includes a tour of the farm including the Shaker Barn, Horse Barn, Cow Barn and visit with the animals of Cracker Box Palace. (If you have a large group, we usually break into smaller groups of 10 – 15 people per group.) Time allowed to tour all the barns and see the animals – approx. 40 minutes.
- **Tractor Drawn Hay Rides** - \$1.00/person with Basic Farm Tour. Otherwise \$3.00 per person. Time allowed: approximately 15 minutes.
- **Stay For Lunch** – We have picnic tables and folding tables if needed in the side yard overlooking Sodus Bay and the horse pasture. Also, if the weather is not favorable, you may use the front porch of the main house, which holds 35 to 40 people. More if small!
- **Wildlife Educator “Kritter Kris & Her Feathered Friends”** \$1/person
Raptors and birds of prey demo available with one week notice– proceeds to benefit this organization.
- **Nature Walk to 2nd Creek** for fossil hunting or to enjoy the scenic water fall. 40 min.
- **Scavenger Hunt** – Have your group hunt for items around the farm while on your tour.
\$1/person
- **Birthday Parties** - \$15 per child. Minimum 15 kids. Parties include meet the animals, tour of the farm, hay ride, cake, drink, tables, decorations, balloons, crown for birthday honoree, coloring book or goodie bag for each guest. (Minimum one week notice). Two hour limit.
- **Apple Picking By The Bag** – (Sept through October) Apple Picking may be combined with a farm visit or be a stand alone visit.
\$1.00 – Kid Size Bag \$3.00 – ½ Peck Bag \$4.00 – 1 Peck Bag
- **Specialty Tours** – Give a theme to your tour and we’ll arrange for special activities throughout your tour. Reading projects that involve farm animals, want to know more about a group of animals.... Let us know at least one month in advance. \$2.00/person

Anything you’d like to add?

We have some suggestions to make your visit more enjoyable.....

1. Dress for the weather. We are located by Great Sodus Bay, so the weather is usually slightly cooler than inland. And there is a lot of walking involved, so wear comfortable shoes and clothes.
2. Water proof shoes are suggested as the grass is usually wet even in the late morning. And if you're planning on visiting the creek it goes without saying!
3. Apple picking – Bring a magic marker to label bags. An empty cardboard box is nice to hold the apples while in the bus/car. Finally our apple bags are paper and they may tear or get wet so a plastic shopping bag makes a great way to secure the apples after they are picked.
4. Visiting the Animals – Cracker Box Palace is a farm animal haven. There are many assorted animals, large and small. We ask as a courtesy to our animals that no one runs, chases or shouts at them and please, no feeding fingers to the animals. Children should be supervised. Just to let you know there are farm dogs and cats that run loose. Although friendly, we caution that they should not be chased or grabbed.
5. The Fossil Walk – It is a hike to Second Creek and everyone is welcome to take home fossils if they wish. But remember, you have to hike back with your treasures so you may want to limit how many you return with!
